SOMERSWORTH SCHOOL DISTRICT - COVID-19 ILLNESS MANAGEMENT PROTOCOLS (REVISED 8-19-2022)

Our goal is to safely offer in-person learning for the duration of the 2022-2023 school year. Please adhere to the following illness management protocols:

Exposure Protocols

If your child is exposed to someone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19, REGARDLESS of your child's vaccination status:

- Your child can stay in school UNLESS they start to show symptoms. Your child does NOT need to isolate or quarantine UNLESS they start to show symptoms.
- The CDC recommends that your child wear a mask for 10 days after exposure to someone with COVID-19.
- You should monitor your child for symptoms for 10 days after exposure to someone with COVID-19.
- You should consult with your child's health care provider to discuss any concerns.

Symptom Management

If your child is showing ANY symptoms of COVID-19, please help keep your child home from school.

If your child develops symptoms at school:

- The child should notify their teacher or the school nurse immediately.
- The school nurse will call the parents to pick up their child from school.
- The child CANNOT return to school for <u>5</u> calendar days and must be FEVER FREE AND OTHER SYMPTOMS IMPROVING for 24 hours without the help of medication UNLESS the child gets tested for COVID-19. To be sure when you can return to school, please contact your school nurse. You can also consult the CDC's isolation calculator at: https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/isolation.html
- The child CAN return to school before the 5-day period ends <u>IF</u> they get tested <u>and</u> have a negative result. Proof of a negative test must be shown to the school nurse. Home test results WILL BE ACCEPTED. TEST RESULTS MUST BE SHOWN TO THE SCHOOL NURSE AND MUST INCLUDE NAME OF STUDENT AND DATE OF TEST.
- Students can also be tested for COVID-19 at school with parent permission. Please contact your school nurse for more information.

If your child develops symptoms at home:

- Please keep your child home from school.
- You should contact the school nurse to inform them that your child has developed symptoms.
- The child CANNOT return to school for <u>5</u> calendar days and must be FEVER FREE AND OTHER SYMPTOMS IMPROVING for 24 hours without the help of medication UNLESS the child gets tested for COVID-19. You can also consult the CDC's isolation calculator at: https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/isolation.html
- The child CAN return to school before the 5-day period ends <u>IF</u> they get tested <u>and</u> have a negative result. Proof of a negative test must be shown to the school nurse. Home test results WILL BE ACCEPTED. TEST RESULTS MUST BE SHOWN TO THE SCHOOL NURSE AND MUST INCLUDE NAME OF STUDENT AND DATE OF TEST.

IF YOUR CHILD HAS TESTED POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

- Your child will need to remain home from school for 5 calendar days. Please contact the school nurse on day 5. You can also consult the CDC's calculator at: https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/isolation.html
- Your child must be fever free without the help of medication and other symptoms are improving for 24 hours before they can return to school.
- DHHS still requires that your child wear a mask on days 6 through 10 when they return to school. If your child does not wear a mask, they will need to remain home for the entire 10-day isolation period.
